STUDENT CONTACTS	I had over 230 student/family/staff contacts for student concerns
IEP MEETINGS	I attended 11 IEP Meetings during this time.
JOM TUTOR REQUESTS	We currently do not have a JOM Tutor at the Middle School Building. Academic support continues to be provided to our students by Mrs. Hagar within our Alternative Learning Academic Center (ALAC) Room and by Mrs. Teran Aide-Academic Coach. The Middle School continues to provide the After School Tutoring Program from 3:30 p.m. to 4:45p.m. Mon.-Thurs. with transportation being provided to the LCO Boys & Girls Club. I would like to encourage our parents/guardians to have their child attend the after school programming for additional academic support.
TRANSPORTS	I made 10 home-visits and transported 8 students/parents/guardians.

<p>SST MEETINGS/AT-RISK MEETINGS</p>	<p>SST Meetings/At-Risk Meetings continue to be set up by Administration. Meetings are conducted with each grade level to update data on student progress quarterly. These measures are taken to provide adequate services to our students before making any referrals for EEN Services and for student success. I would also like to remind the parents/guardians that each grade level team of teachers are available to meet with parents/guardians on a needed basis for any concern for their child throughout the school year. The 6th Grade Team meets daily at 11:00a.m., the 7th Grade Team meets daily at 2:00p.m., and the 8th Grade Team meets daily at 9:00a.m. Please do not hesitate to contact the school office at 715-638-9401 if you have any concerns or would like to schedule a team meeting.</p>
<p>TRUANCY PREVENTION</p>	<p>I continue to work closely with the Middle School Office and Administration to monitor school attendance for our students. The students and parents/guardians continue to do a great job in verifying and providing documentation for absences. I strongly encourage our parents/guardians to continue with this communication to avoid any truancy issues. Attendance issues do become more of a concern as the school year continues. I would like to remind our parents/guardians to keep a close eye on attendance as we are now in the 4th Quarter and some of our students have used all their excused days. Remember to use pre-arranged absences when needed.</p>
<p>TRAININGS/EVENTS</p>	<p>The Lac Courte Oreilles Boys & Girls Club continues to offer our young people a positive place to be with various programming, curriculum and events. I encourage parents/guardians to have their child become a club member to enjoy all the activities the club has to offer. The club is making more of an effort to having family events to help our families to stay strong and close during these difficult times we are experiencing in our community.</p> <p>There will be two Childhood Trauma Workshops presented</p>

to our community on April 26th and April 27th with no cost. The presenter is Michael Joranger, LCSW Coordinator from Saint A, Milwaukee, WI. Workshop 1 is being offered the evening of Thursday April 26th from 5:00pm-9:00pm at the Hayward High School Auditorium. This workshop is being offered to those you cannot attend the day time workshop. Workshop 2 is being offered on April 27th from 9:00am-12:00pm at the Kinnamon Building on the corner of Kwy K and Hwy E. These workshops are being sponsored by the LCO Birth to Three Program, LCO Early Head Start Program, and the Emergency Preparedness Program. Please contact Deanna Baker at 715-638-5186, Alisha DeBrot at 715-634-7262, or Patty Subera at 715-638-5179 to register (however registration is not required, but appreciated) by April 23rd. This workshop is being offered to everyone who wants to make a difference in a child's life. Relationships are key to reaching a child that has been traumatized.

The Lac Courte Oreilles Behavioral Health Program along with the Lac Courte Oreilles Tribal Leaders have collaborated with Sawyer County Health and Human Services in sponsoring a Town Hall titled Opioid/Methamphetamine Crises on Saturday, April 28th from 6:00pm - 8:00pm. at the Sevenwinds Casino Convention Center. This gathering will have tribal, county and state representatives to address the crisis within our community. We are seeking support at all levels to address this serious health concern. Community members are encouraged to attend to voice their concerns.

'Giwii Mino Bimaadizimin' Prevention Coalition will be meeting on April 25th, 2018 at the Kinnamon School off of Junction Hwys. K & E beginning at 11:00 a.m. Community members are welcome to attend the meeting to learn about the various programming that is being offered in our community to all ages. Valuable support is being provided throughout the tribe, county and state in addressing the health concerns and needs of our community.

<p>NEW BUSINESS</p>	<p>Trauma Informed Care continues to be strongly emphasized throughout the Hayward Community School District, the Lac Courte Oreilles Tribe, and Sawyer County. Efforts are being made across the board to support our students/families with various programming.</p> <p>The Mental Health/AODA health concerns also continue to be strongly emphasized within the Hayward Community School District and the Lac Courte Oreilles Tribe. The Lac Courte Oreilles Tribe has declared the Opiate Addictions an epidemic. The tribe along with the county and the state continue to take the measures needed to address this serious health concern within our community.</p> <p>I would like to remind our parents/guardians of The ‘Memorandum of Understanding’ which has recently been approved by the Hayward Community School District’s School Board. This allows a service provider to come into the school setting to deliver counseling services to their client. The provider will need to sign the ‘Memorandum of Understanding’ before they meet with their client. This added support is very valuable to our students and their families.</p> <p>Lac Courte Oreilles Comprehensive Community Services (LCO-CCS) is a program offered through the Lac Courte Oreilles Health Center for tribal members and their families who need ongoing services for a mental health illness, substance use disorder, or dual diagnosis disorder. Each individual works with a dedicated team of service providers to develop a treatment and recovery plan that meets the</p>

	unique needs and goals of the person. The goal of the community-based approach is to promote better overall health and life satisfaction. Wellness gatherings are being held monthly on the 2 nd Thursday of every month at 12929 W Haskins Road from 6:00-8:00p.m.

MISSION STATEMENT: The mission of the PAC is to assist and advise the Hayward Community School District, Board of Education and Administration on all matters pertaining to the successful educational experience of Indian students.

STUDENT CONTACTS	I have had 111 student contacts, requests for assistance or student discussions with staff/families since my last IEPAC HSC Report.
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IEP MEETINGS	I attended 17 IEP meetings, many of which were transition IEPs for 8 th grade students scheduling high school classes.
TRANSPORTS/PARENT VISITS	I had two transports, one of which was a home visit. I have had numerous phone calls with parents to assist with missing computers, missing assignments, academic coaching, JOM Tutor referrals and assisting parents to get students passing classes.
CARE CONFS/SST/ AT-RISK MEETINGS	I have attended two staff Care Conference; three student/family Care Conferences.
ATTENDANCE/TRUANCY PREVENTION WORK	<p>We have completed the third term. Students with attendance challenges are continuing to run low or run out of excused absences (ten allotted per year). At a minimum, if students need to miss school, it is imperative that they make up the work missed during absences in a timely manner.</p> <p>PARENTS: Please monitor Skyward with your students regarding ATTENDANCE, GRADES and MISSING ASSIGNMENTS.</p> <p>If you do not know your Skyward password, please contact me.</p>
NATIVE AMERICAN CULTURE CLUB	Our club is currently working on fundraisers to attend Festival of Nations in St. Paul on May 3.
TRAININGS/EVENTS	<p>I attended the Statewide Training for Title VI Indian Educational Staff in Stevens Point on March 26. Mr. Stark also attended, one of very few Administrators in attendance.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">--over→</p> <p>Our next big event in the Guidance Department is getting students scheduled for next school year. We have already accumulated Course Selection Sheets for our 9th, 10th and 11th grade students. Arena scheduling begins Wednesday, April 11, and concludes on Friday, April 13.</p> <p>We are also heavily focused on senior grades, as it relates to graduation status. Seniors only have 32 days left of high school!</p> <p>I continue to actively serve on the following committees: Governor's Juvenile Justice Commission; Adolescent</p>

	Health Committee; and, LCO CST Coordinating Committee.

STUDENT CONTACTS	I have had over 210 student contacts or requests for assistance since our last IEPAC meeting in January.
IEP MEETINGS	I have attended 6 IEP meetings since the last IEPAC meeting in March.
JOM TUTOR REQUESTS	I have not submitted any referrals for JOM Tutoring to Liz Thayer since the last meeting. The JOM tutor requests for the Intermediate School are as followed: 13 students in 3 rd grade, 7 students in 4 th grade, and 27 students in 5 th grade. Liz Thayer (JOM tutor) has a total of 47 students.
TRANSPORTS	I have had 4 transports throughout the month.
ATTENDANCE	We are closely monitoring attendance for unexcused absences. Families are receiving a notification letter when a student has three unexcused absences. If a student reaches the fifth unexcused absence, families receive a notification for a meeting which is held at the
